



Using Doodle as a digital homework tool

Case study: Bermuda High School, the Americas

By encouraging pupils to use Doodle 'little and often', Bermuda High School have been able to rebuild their pupils' love of learning and boost their confidence.

We spoke to Nichola, the school's Maths Lead, about how Doodle has helped to promote healthy learning habits and enabled staff to identify the gaps in children's knowledge.

Hi Nichola! Please could you give us a brief overview of how you use Doodle in your school?

Students are expected to use Doodle during the week and are encouraged to be in the green zone (a zone they can reach by earning a target number of stars set by Doodle) by Friday. All the students from Year 1-6 use it as a home learning tool, and we have also used it at school in Maths Centres.

The students who achieve 100-day streaks get a free grub day, and in Year 5 they are given slips for a treat jar where they can earn classroom rewards. We also take a photo of them to share on our school's website home page. They also receive certificates and house points for participating.

Do parents get involved with Doodle at home?

Parents have encouraged the girls to participate in Doodle's Challenges (seasonal events where children can earn rewards by using Doodle 'little and often'). Their feedback has been very positive.

Has Doodle had an impact on pupils' confidence and attainment?

The students who actively participate enjoy the programme. They enjoy being given certificates and being recognized for their maths. Each week I let classes and teachers know who is a Top Doodler.

And finally, has Doodle helped to reduce staff workloads?

Teachers can see which students need to practice certain skills. It helps staff differentiate between the varying academic needs of students by being able to set extra work for those who need a challenge, and at times recalibrate the programme for those who are struggling. We use the data from Doodle for assessments.
