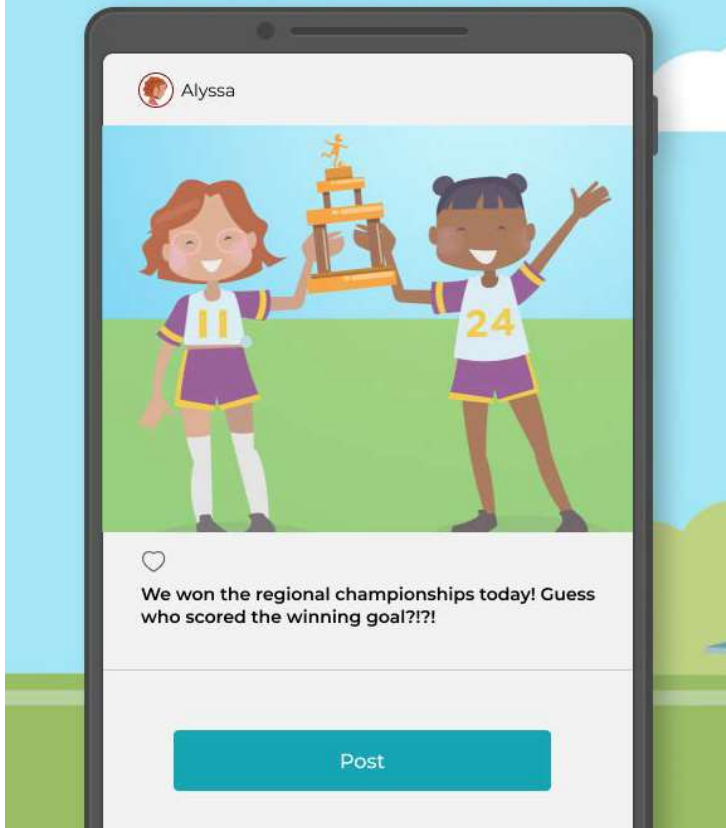

Tweens and Teens today are spending more than 8.5 hours per day in front of a screen.
