## About this course

Vault is a personal finance course for pupils aged 9–11, designed to inspire and equip them to make wise financial decisions and promote financial wellbeing over their lifetime. The course is an imaginative exploration of financial concepts combined with rich storytelling.

Pupils join a group of friends who are transported to different worlds where they need to help the main character solve a financially-based problem. Once students have helped solve the problems, they are prompted to complete a personal reflection on the financial literacy skills they have gained. Finally, they are challenged to apply these skills in a game which they must complete to enter the next world and meet their new challenge!

The course has been designed in partnership with teachers and subject experts, and needs minimal preparation: all the subject knowledge you need is built in.

Vault has been accredited with Young Enterprise's prestigious Financial Education Quality Mark and the course is linked to national curricula in PSHE (and related subjects), English, Maths and Personal Development.

### Module 1

#### Financial Decision-Making:

### Module 2

#### Budgeting and spending:

Set short-term and long-term financial goals and make a plan for achieving those goals.

#### Income and careers:

Consider interest and skills when making decisions about future jobs and careers.

### Module 4

#### Credit and borrowing:

Engage in appropriate borrowing behaviours that build positive relationships and explore some of the risks associated with borrowing and debt.

#### Future planning:

Create positive, informed relationships with financial institutions to protect and grow money for the future.
